What is PKD?

> Polycystic kidney disease (PKD) is a chronic, genetic disease, causing uncontrolled growth of fluid-filled cysts in the kidneys often leading to kidney failure. It affects all gender, racial and ethnic groups equally.

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> A typical kidney is the size of a

human fist and weighs about a third of a pound. Polycystic kidneys can be much larger, growing as large as a football.

- > There are two types of PKD. Both are genetic: autosomal dominant (ADPKD) and autosomal recessive (ARPKD).
- > There is no cure, but the PKD Foundation is dedicated to finding treatments and a cure for PKD.
